Students in year 9 also enjoyed making crumpets from the support of this new programme, which provides ingredients to schools at no cost.









Members of the School Council have been working with Sustrans, the custodian of the National Cycle Network, to further develop our safer streets initiative.






Enrichment


What an enjoyable last session of football club.

This was followed by a tour of Cape Coast Castle - the largest of the buildings which contains the legacy of the trans-Atlantic slave trade and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



But our day didn't end there... after a short drive we arrived at Kakum National Park to walk across its 7 suspension bridges which form a 333-meter long canopy walkway, suspended up to 27 meters above the forest floor from trees that are over 300 years old.

Bucket list goals were ticked off that day, especially for the geographers.
