A book of the writings from the Dutch-language *diary* kept by *Anne Frank* while she was in hiding for two years with her family during the Nazi occupation of the Netherlands



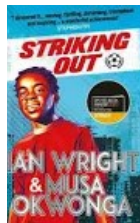
The Final Year by **Matt Goodfellow**

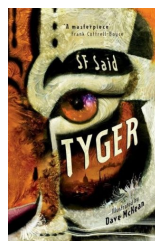
Striking Out by **Ian Wright & Musa Okwonga**

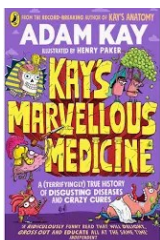
The Boy who made Monsters by **Jenny Pearson**

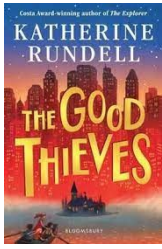

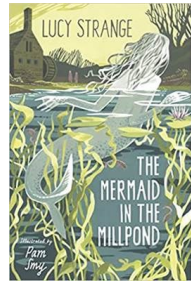
The Ballroom Thief by Aneesa Marufu

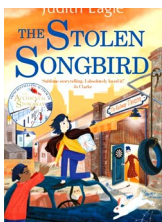
Swan Song by Gill Lewis

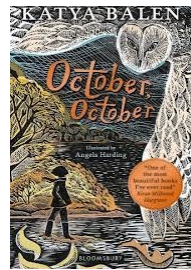
The Mermaid in the Millpond by Lucy Strange

Tally is autistic and she can't cover it up no matter how hard she tries. Will her friends stand by her as she moves up to secondary school? **AR 5.6**



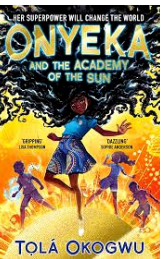
The Stolen Songbird by Judith Eagle

October and her Dad live in the woods and they are wild. And that's the way it is until October turns 11 and everything in her world changes. **AR 5.7**



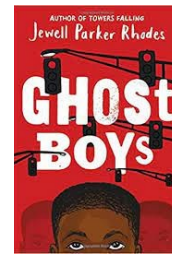
D-Day Dog by Tom Palmer

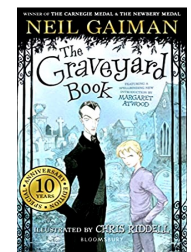
The Baby-Sitters Club by Ann M Martin
